**SUKKOT** begins at sundown on Friday, October 2<sup>nd</sup> and concludes at sundown on Friday, October 9<sup>th</sup>. There will be a sukkah at the shul and invitations to decorate and dwell in it in COVID-safe ways. A lulav will be available for shaking. There will be willow branches at the shul for you to take home for Shemini Atzeret.

**SHEMINI ATZERET** begins at sundown on Friday, October 9<sup>th</sup> and concludes at sundown on Saturday, October 10<sup>th</sup>. This is the day when we first pray for rain! If we were together at the shul—and if it weren't Shabbat—we would beat our willows on the ground to remind the Heavens to bring us rain. Since we won't be, and it will be, consider getting willow branches from the shul or collecting your own and beating them on the 9<sup>th</sup>, Hoshana Rabbah, the day of the Great Water Pouring.

**SIMCHAT TORAH!** Sunday, October 11<sup>th</sup>, beginning at 2:00 PM, the TORAH MOBILE rides again! This time it will stop at seven locations and invite you to come meet the *sefer Torah* and circle in a *hakafah* around the MOBILE. The route will be announced in the fulness of time!
